Treatment Foster Care

Anu Family Services provides exceptional care to children in need through our Treatment Foster Care program. Our specialized training equips foster parents to support children with significant emotional, behavioral, social, or medical needs, prioritizing healing and positive outcomes. We believe every child deserves the chance to thrive, and our Treatment Foster Care program helps make that a reality.

Treatment Foster Care Advisory Council

Anu Family Services established the Foster Parent Advisory Council in 2018, led by the Director of Treatment Foster Care, Dave Newman. The council meets monthly to maintain high standards and support fellow foster parents. Council members are advocates for children in their care and offer valuable insights to navigate foster care complexities.

Foster Parents Needed!

In 2022, 1,143 children were referred to Anu Family Services. Sadly, we were only able to place 82 children in Anu foster homes.

Parent Coaching

Our Parent Coaching program provides caregivers—whether biological, foster, kinship, or adoptive parents with practical tools to rapidly and dramatically improve their child's behavior. Through personalized coaching, parents learn to connect with their children on a deeper level, instilling hope and nurturing well-being.

Community-Based Flexible Support

provides in-home and community-based education and support to help adults and youth increase their independence, life skills, and community connections. We are proud to provide personalized, trauma-informed services that empower our clients to take control of their recovery journey and achieve lasting wellness. Our Flexible Support Specialists:

- Support clients in learning daily living skills
- Identify and teach skills that promote community engagement
- Encourage healthy decision-making
- Provide education on self-care techniques
- Offer youth coaching to increase social and emotional skills

Our Impact:

- 100% of clients who completed the program demonstrated measurable progress toward their recovery goals.
- 84% of clients reported increased satisfaction with their overall wellness, independence, connections, and well-being.



Youth Coaching

In 2021, our Community-Based Flexible Support launched Youth Coaching services. Our Youth Coaches provide individualized support to help young people build healthy relationships and discover their potential. Through our program, youth can improve their:

- Communication skills
- Problem-solving skills
- Resiliency
- Life balance
- Health and wellness
- Character strengths

Partnering to support student well-being and resiliency...

In 2022, Anu proudly partnered with the Chippewa Falls School District Cardinal Care Team to provide parent coaching and youth coaching to promote student well-being and resiliency. This vital collaboration continues to advance our shared mission of fostering well-being within our community.

Individualized Trauma Services

Our Individualized Trauma Services (ITS) support children and adults who have experienced trauma and attachment disruptions. Our ITS Resiliency Specialists:

- Build trusting relationships with clients
- Provide education on trauma and attachment
- Teach coping skills and emotional regulation tools

Our Resiliency Specialists:

- Meet clients in various community-based settings
- Provide a supplement to therapy

Anu's Parent Coaching Certification Course

Our certification course equips participants with the skills and tools to work effectively with parents, foster parents, kinship parents, and other caregivers. Certified coaches are trained in hands-on, practical methods for achieving rapid and dramatic improvements in a child's behavior. They help parents and caregivers strengthen their relationships with their children and teach them effective ways of interacting with the world, even in the face of trauma. In doing so, they help parents and caregivers reach their full potential and empower children to do the same.

Anu's Parent Coaching Certification equips participants with:

- Skills and tools to work with parents, foster parents, kinship parents, and caregivers
- Methods to rapidly improve a child's behavior
- Ways to strengthen relationships and interact effectively, even in the face of trauma
- Capacity to help parents and caregivers reach their full potential and empower children to do the same

Certified Parent Coaches lift parents and caregivers to their higher selves, so they can lift their children to theirs.
